#### **Historical Note:**

The oldest American Bach Choir was formed in 1898 due to the creative passion of J. Fred Wolle and the organizational efforts of Ruth Porter Doster. Growing up in the Moravian Church inspired in Wolle an appreciation for music, manifested through his first choral endeavor in 1882, the Bethlehem Choral Union, and his rigorous study in Munich under Joseph Rheinberger. Upon his return to the United States, he envisioned a performance of Bach's demanding "Mass in B Minor." His Choral Union lost enthusiasm for the arduous task, but Wolle persisted. Several years later, coupled with the work of Ruth Porter Doster, a new choir was organized and gave the performance of the first complete American "Mass in B Minor" in 1900. The Bach Choir grew steadily in recognition and popularity with its annual festival, held in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Performances at Carnegie Hall and in Washington, D.C. increased the Choir's following, attracting thousands of visitors to the festivals held every year in May.

### **Collection Scope and Contents:**

The Bach Choir Collection consists of annual festival programs between 1900 and 2000, programs for several special events between 1915 and 1951, and publicity items including newspaper clipping scrapbooks and articles. Please consult the Bethlehem Bach Choir for information about their archival holdings.

The Collection is divided in two series: Programs (1900-2000) and Publicity Files (1901-1972). The **Programs** series consists of a complete run of annual festival programs (often in duplicate) between 1900 and 1981. The Library holds some later programs as well (please see container list below for more details). Programs not only list the scheduled performances, but also provide the score and detailed information about the performed pieces. Names of all participants are also included. No festival was held in 1902, 1906-1911, 1924, and 1933. A subseries contains programs for special events such as the 1917 Carnegie Hall performance and Dr. Wolle's memorial service in 1933. The **Publicity Files** series consists of articles and newspaper clippings about the Bach Choir. A list of the articles is provided in the container list (see below). Microfilm copies of Bethlehem Bach Choir scrapbooks are available and three scrapbooks compiled by BAPL staff complete the series.

### **Organization of the Bach Choir Collection**

The Collection is housed in the Bethlehem Room. Copies of festival programs, 1900-1981 are available in 4 transluscent shelf files in the Local History 783 locked shelves. The rest of the materials are shelved in the Local History Storage section.
