It's been an immense undertaking involving years of planning, hundreds of community partners, millions of dollars, and a heartwarming outpouring of generosity from donors big and small. This year the last book was shelved, the last computer installed, the final coat of paint and square of carpet laid down. We cut the ribbon with members of the BAPL family and members of the Barnard family, without whose generosity this monumental achievement would not have been reached. 
Bethlehem revved up over free bicycle




